He continues to consult with clients, other attorneys and accountants on special cases and projects and has served as Guardian Ad Litem for the Surrogate's Court of Westchester County on various estate and guardianship cases. Prior to his private legal practice, he was an Associate Tax Counsel for Gulf & Western Industries, Inc. and Consolidated Cigar Company and was an estate tax attorney for the Internal Revenue Service.
